

Flowing mountain roads and open valleys define the drive, paired with a refined lunch at Palé Hall before continuing through the Clwydian Range and Dee Valley. The day concludes with an elegant overnight stay at The Chester Grosvenor, a landmark five-star hotel in the heart of the historic city, with guests enjoying dinner in the hotel to round off the opening day in refined surroundings.

Day Two
Friday 20th March



Chester | Yorkshire Dales
North Pennines | Northumberland

Leaving the bustling city behind, the route heads towards the Yorkshire Dales, defined by dramatic limestone landscapes and lush green valleys. Cannonballers will enjoy lunch at The Fell Hotel, a charming boutique country hotel set in the picturesque village of Burnsall, in the heart of the national park. The journey continues north through the North Pennines, often referred to as England's last wilderness, before concluding with an overnight stay at the luxurious Matfen Hall, a premier five-star country estate set within historic parkland near Hadrian's Wall, with Cannonballers dining in the hotel to end the day in refined surroundings.





Day Three
Saturday 21st March



Northumberland | Hadrian's Wall
Scottish Borders

Crossing north through Northumberland National Park, the route follows open countryside and historic roads alongside Hadrian's Wall before continuing into the Scottish Borders. Quaint villages and sweeping landscapes define the drive, offering a relaxed pace as the tour enters Scotland. The day concludes with arrival at Schloss Roxburghe, a five-star luxury estate set within expansive parkland, with Cannonballers enjoying dinner in the hotel as they settle in for the first of two nights.



Day Four


Sunday 22nd March



Mennock Pass | Galloway Forest Park
Scottish Borders

Day Four explores the south of Scotland, offering a fresh direction for the tour and new territory compared with the traditional Highland routes. The drive includes the dramatic Mennock Pass, a route through the Southern Uplands, before continuing into Galloway Forest Park, the UK's largest forest park, often referred to as the "Highlands of the Lowlands." Sweeping scenery, quiet roads, and open landscapes define the day, before returning to Schloss Roxburghe for the final night of the tour.


